## The Kingdom of the Ants

If you have ever run barefoot across a hot beach, you can imagine what it is like for ants in the dessert to rush across the sand in $60^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ heat searching for food.

Silver ants can survive ground temperatures higher than any other animal. They will travel up to a third of a mile in search of food to take back to their nest.

Sometimes they run on four of their six legs, holding the other two up to cool. Silver ants also take cooling breaks by running to the top of a leaf of grass, away from the hot sand. After a few moments of cooling off, they go back down and are back in action.

You may have seen pictures or nature programs showing long lines of ants walking across the forest. Each ant carries a big piece of leaf, holding it over its back.

When these ants reach their nest, they don't eat the leaves immediately. Instead, they chew the leaves up, throw them out of their mouth, and store them in underground spaces.

One ant nest may have 2,000 rooms with up to 300 of those chewed leaves and 3 million to 7 million workers.

These ants survive because they work together. They live in communities and cooperate to get things done. That's a lesson we humans would do well to learn.

## What is the difference between weather and climate?

We hear about weather and climate all of the time. Most of us check the local weather forecast to plan our days. And climate change is certainly a "hot" topic in the news. There is, however, still a lot of confusion over the difference between these two terms.

Think about it this way: Climate is what you expect, weather is what you get.
Weather is what you see outside your window on any certain day. So, for example, it may be $24^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ and sunny or it could be minus $7^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ with heavy snow. That's the weather.

Climate is the typical weather. For example, you can expect snow in January or sunny and hot days in July. This is climate. The climate also includes very high temperatures or a lot of rainfall for a certain season. If you have ever heard your local weather person say "today we hit a record high in temperature for this day", she is talking about climate records.

In most places, weather can change from minute-to-minute, hour-to-hour, day-to-day, and season-to-season. Climate, however, is the typical weather over years.

Matthew Youlden speaks nine languages and understands more than a dozen more. He is a polyglot. A polyglot is a multilingual person or a speaker of several foreign languages. But Matthew is more than a polyglot as he can fluently and comfortably talk to native speakers in their own languages.

Matthew, who is originally from Manchester, England, is a language chameleon: Germans think he's German, Spaniards think he's Spanish, Brazilians think he's Portuguese. According to Matthew, the more languages you speak, the more points of view on the world you have:
"I think every language has a certain way of seeing the world. Each language is a different world and a different understanding of the world. I couldn't choose only one language because it would mean not accepting the possibility to see the world in many different ways. So a person, with only one language, is the saddest and the loneliest person. Unfortunately, this means that he or she sees the world in the most boring way, too. There are so many advantages of learning a language; I really can't think of any reason not to."
