1. Project outline

A. PROJECT BACKGROUND

The European Higher Education Fairs (EHEF) in Central Asia and Asia project is funded by the European Union, and is being implemented by the partner companies in the consortium led by S.I.C.I Dominus, over the period 2014 to 2016.

The project has two core objectives:

- •Promote study opportunities in the EU to students from Asia and Central Asia;
- •Showcase and to promote cooperation in the higher-education sphere between the EU and countries in Asia and Central Asia.




B. PROJECT ACTIVITIES (standard project approach approved by DG DEVCO)

European Higher Education Fairs will be held in 5 countries (Vietnam, Kazakhstan, China, India, Malaysia), and will normally comprise the following programme of linked activities:

- •Communication and visibility activities will be held in the host country to form a 'European Higher Education Week,' culminating in the following events...
- •The Fair itself, at which approximately 60 to 80 exhibitors from EU highereducation systems will present information to thousands of visitors (potential students). Exhibitors are NOT charged a fee for attendance (only need to cover travel and accommodation costs).
- •A Policy and Cooperation Symposium, at which invited experts (from the host country and from the EU) will present to an audience of higher-education lecturers and administrators, policy officials and other stakeholders.















B. PROJECT ACTIVITIES (cont'd)

European Higher Education Roadshows will be held in various locations. These will be smaller-scale, policy and cooperation conference events, which are intended to extend the outreach of the EHEF project. The focus will be on discussion of cooperation between the EU and the host countries in the sphere of higher education.

Virtual project activities

The EHEF project website (www.ehef.asia) serves as an information platform for the project, and provides outreach to stakeholders across the two regions. The website is used to showcase the higher-education sectors of EU Member States, and to provide information on forthcoming and past events.



2. Planning for EHEF China 2015:

2.1 Standard project approach needs to be adapted

- •China Education Expo 2015 is only possible venue (self-standing event not feasible)
- •BUT project resources not sufficient to support directly the exhibition attendance of the anticipated number of EU HEIs (size of event, scale of costs)

Alternative model of support proposed by DG DEVCO and EUD Beijing

- •Project to support enhanced EU visibility and impact (complementing MS national and institutional level presence at CEE)
- •Details to be decided. Options include:
 - EU 'Corner' within exhibition area
 - Additional EU visibility activities/resources pre- and during event
 - Support for enlarged seminar schedule
 - Your suggestions...















2.2 Consultation process

- •Feedback requested from Member States by **20 March 2015** (suggestions for use of project resources towards aim of achieving enhanced EU visibility at CEE 2015)
- •EHEF Working Group Beijing 2015 project team to liaise with MS focal points by email to elicit feedback and share outcomes of consultation process
- •DG DEVCO and EUD China to make decision on format of project support, following consultation process completion

- 3.1 Rationale and Format (standard project approach)
- •Discussion of cooperation in HE sphere, discussion of policy priorities
- •Conference format plenary sessions + seminar/workshop sessions
- •Participants (80-100):
 - ✓ Higher-education sector representatives academics, administrators (+ students/alumni representatives)
 - ✓ Ministry representatives
 - ✓ Employers
 - ✓ Representatives of EUD, EU MS agencies, embassies
 - ✓ Presenters (EU and China)













3. 2 Consultation process for EU-China event

- •Marking of 40th anniversary of diplomatic relations contribution of HE sector
- •Consultations underway with Ministry of Education of China, CEAIE, EUD, DG EAC (regarding format, venue, dates, themes, participants, etc)
- •Project team will update EHEF Working Group Beijing on progress, and elicit feedback and proposals at the relevant stages of planning (themes, case studies, contributors)
