The General Information Brochure (GIB) will be conveyed to eligible countries and territories about twelve weeks prior to the commencement of the course.




Interested applicants should submit a complete application by the closing date, if they meet the following criteria:

- Suitably qualified and holding relevant portfolios



Successful applicants will receive a Letter of Acceptance (LOA) and Confirmation Letter. Please do the following:

- Complete and return the Confirmation Letter
- Ensure your passport or travel document has a minimum six-month validity period and if required, the visa(s) for transits and/or entry into Singapore
- Bring along the LOA to Singapore to facilitate airport clearance

Technology presents tremendous opportunities but also serious threats such as cyber attacks on critical infrastructure, data breaches, and the vulnerabilities of the Internet of Things. This cluster looks at Singapore's Smart Nation strategy with courses on cybersecurity, geospatial analysis for policy planning, urban transport management, and FinTech.
