FOREWORD




The Singapore Cooperation Programme (SCP) is founded on the belief that human capital is critical for sustainable national development. - Suitably qualified and holding relevant portfolios

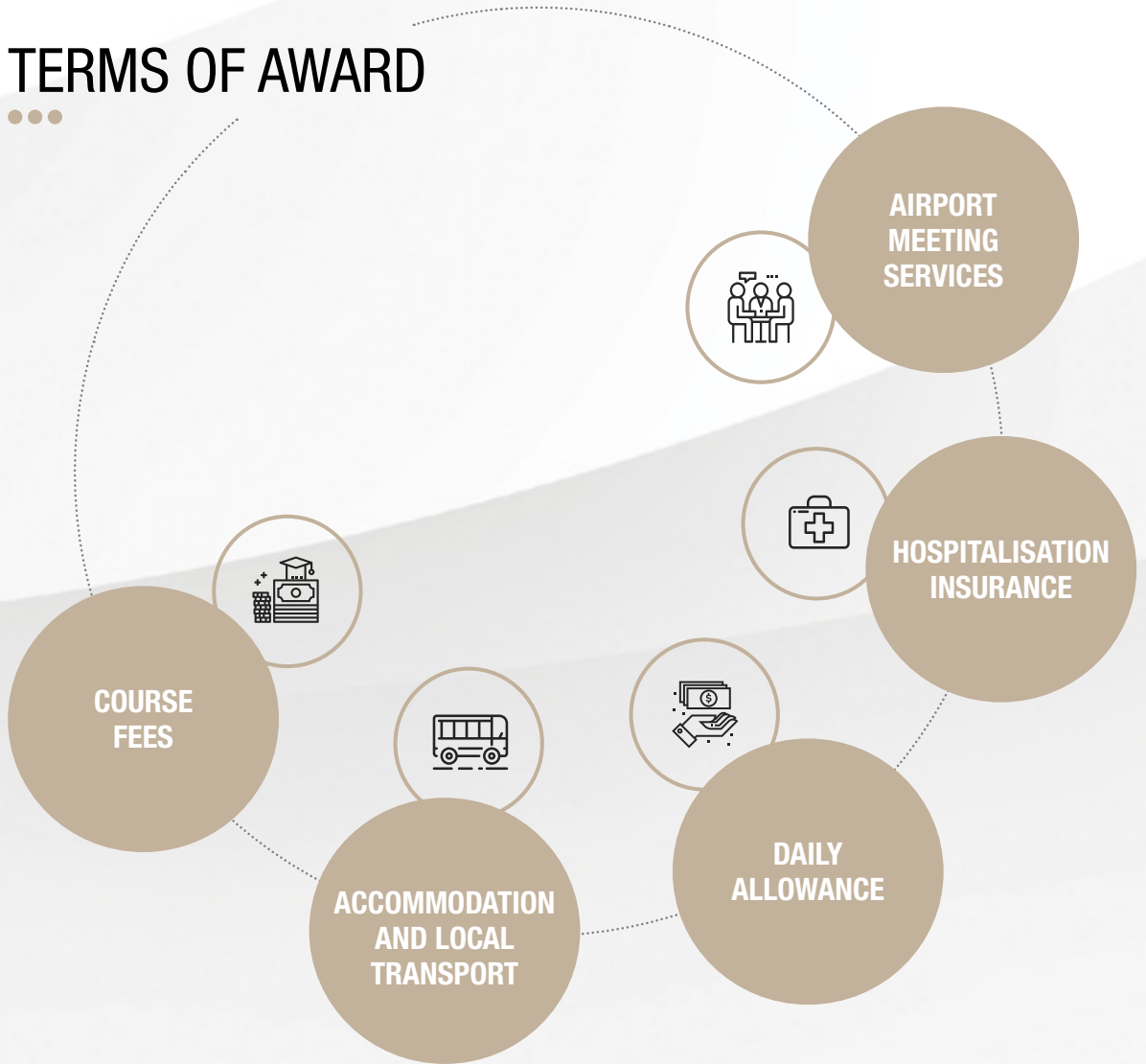
03 CONFIRMATION
