The Hubble Space Telescope

The Hubble Space Telescope (HST) is named after Edwin P. Hubble, the American astronomer who confirmed that the universe is expanding, which provides the foundation for the Big Bang theory and Einstein’s theory of general relativity.

In the 1920s, Edwin Hubble used the 100-inch telescope at Mt. Wilson Observatory in Los Angeles – then the largest telescope in the world – to discover that the Andromeda is its own galaxy. It was previously believed that the Andromeda galaxy, and others like it, were “spiral nebulas” within the Milky Way galaxy.

Although the HST is named after Hubble, its history begins with another man: Lyman Spitzer. In 1946, Spitzer was a professor and researcher at Yale University. He wrote a paper entitled “Astronomical Advantages of an Extra-Terrestrial Observatory”, in which he argues that a space-based telescope could take clearer photos by evading Earth’s atmosphere and could detect electromagnetic frequencies that ground-based telescopes cannot. Decades later, in the 1970s, Spitzer helped lead NASA’s lobbying efforts for Hubble.

Don’t feel bad for Lyman Spitzer though. He eventually got his name on a telescope. NASA’s Spitzer Space Telescope launched in 2003.

The HST launched in April 1990 from the Space Shuttle Discovery and took its first image of a star cluster 1,300 light years away, NGC 352, a little over a month later. The image is notoriously unremarkable.

China's Population Growth Rate Falls to 61-year Low

China's population growth rate has fallen to its lowest level in six decades, despite major government efforts to increase population growth and avoid a demographic crisis. Across China, 10.62 million babies were born in 2021, a rate of 7.52 per thousand people, the National Bureau of Statistics said on Monday. In the same period 10.14 million deaths were recorded, a mortality rate of 7.18 per thousand, producing a population growth rate of just 0.34 per thousand head of population.

The rate of growth is the lowest since 1960, and adds to the findings of last May's once-a-decade census, which found an average annual rise of 0.53%, down from 0.57% reported from 2000 to 2010.

China, like much of East Asia, is in the grip of a population crisis, with lowering birth-rates, and predictions of imminent negative population growth and an ageing population. Monday's figures showed the proportion of over-60s in China rose from 18.7% in 2020 to 18.9%.

Beijing has announced major reforms to address the decline, including raising the retirement age. A three-child policy has replaced the two-child policy that was introduced in 2016 and had sparked a slight increase in births before falling again. The high cost of living, delayed marriages and lack of social mobility are frequently cited as contributing factors to young Chinese people's reluctance to have children. In response, Beijing promised better access to childcare and maternity leave.

Professor Wang Feng from the University of California Irvine, who specialises in Asian demographics, said the results showed that the root causes ran deeper than the policymakers realised. He said: "Without addressing the deeply rooted causes, which discourage young Chinese from getting married and having children – from gender inequality to high living cost – what we are seeing now is likely just the beginning of a further decline in birth-rate and a prolonged process of population decline in China."

Ashley Stone hates being woken up. "If I were an animal, I would be a sloth, 100 percent," said Ashley, 30, who has a long history of sleeping through multiple alarms.

But since December, Ashley said her mornings have improved dramatically, and she credits her new sunrise alarm clock, which gradually fills her room with light before emitting soft sounds when the light is at its brightest.

Sunrise alarm clocks, also known as dawn simulators, are a "growing trend". While the concept of using artificial light to mimic the sun isn't new, experts say the clocks have

become more mainstream in recent years - and there's science to back up the potential benefits.

Sunrise alarm clocks essentially combine a digital alarm with an artificial light source designed to mimic natural dawn or morning light. Some are simple devices that emit a sudden bright light on a timer, creating an effect similar to waking up on a sunny morning and immediately opening shades or curtains. Others use more complex technology and simulate natural light cycles, such as dawn and dusk, by gradually changing the wavelengths and intensity of light over time.

Using a sunrise alarm clock could help establish a regular rhythm of light exposure, which in turn could lead to more consistent wake and sleep times. This alarm clock is really helpful during dark winter months when the sun rises later but you still have to wake up at the same time.
