Under the leadership of Program Directors Prof. Dr. Heidrun Stoeger and Prof. Drs. Albert Ziegler and their research teams at the University of Regensburg and the University of Erlangen-Nuremberg (Germany), Global Talent Mentoring is available to young people everywhere—free of charge—from all cultural and financial backgrounds. Our partners coordinate nearly 100 countries on five continents.

Is Global Talent Mentoring right for me?

- You are between 16 and 23 years old and talented in and extremely motivated to pursue excellence in a specific domain in STEMM. You already spend your free time learning about your chosen STEMM domain and also participate in competitions relating to your chosen STEMM field.
- You are ready to commit at least 60 minutes each week to work with your mentor and be an active member of our community. You could imagine participating long-term—up to ten years!
- You are ready to receive mentee training, collaborate on projects, and attend live online events.
- You can communicate well enough in English that you could easily interact with your mentor and other participants. We do not expect perfect English.
